Coughing our way to Christmas!

We need to be clear on the rules to keep us all safe. Today there are several children absent from school because they have a cough. It's up to parents to determine whether a cough could be a symptom of Covid-19. The NHS guidance says:



- **a new, continuous cough** – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)

It's important to remember that a Lateral Flow Test is **not sufficient** to determine whether this is Covid-19 or not. If you suspect your child may have Covid then you should get a PCR test to confirm whether the virus is present or not. Children should stay at home until these results are received. We can send home learning if your child is well enough to do it.

Lateral Flow Tests are useful when your child has come into contact with Covid19 but is not displaying any symptoms. In this situation a negative daily LFT will mean it is safe to send children to school. Children do not need to stay off school if a member of their household has Covid-19, but we do ask that daily Lateral Flow Tests are done while they remain symptom-free.

The government's main priority is to avoid further disruption to learning and so we are no longer sending home whole class bubbles when a case is confirmed. However, local cases of Covid among children in the district are at the highest level I have seen since the start of the pandemic. It will only take a small number of cases at Bodsham for the school to be required to implement our outbreak management plan – which will include cancelling Christmas events that involve parents.

All the usual precautions of enhanced handwashing, anti-viral cleaning and respiratory hygiene remain in place at school. We now have air quality monitors in the classrooms that help teachers maintain adequate ventilation which will also reduce the risk of transmission between children. Please help us keep the hope of a 'normal' Christmas alive. Later in the newsletter you will find details of how we hope December will look!

Bishop Rose's visit

Last week we were lucky to have a visit from the Bishop of Dover, Rose Hudson-Wilkins. Bodsham was chosen as one of the first schools for her to visit in this Deanery. Bishop Rose met with our School Council (who asked her some challenging questions such as "are you a good person?" and "do you want to be Archbishop of Canterbury?"), then she blessed our Spiritual Garden to encourage the children to use this space for quiet reflection if they want to talk to God. Finally, she joined us in a joyful sung worship where she was impressed by the enthusiasm of our singing! Bishop Rose is an inspirational figure and I am sure our children gained a great deal from meeting her!



Kindness Beats Bullies

Next week is Anti-Bullying week and our children are taking a lead in getting the message across. Each class will have a special lesson about Kindness during the week and there will be a 'One Kind Word' display in each classroom where acts of kindness will be celebrated all week.



Please can all children wear odd socks to school on Monday to support our Anti-Bullying week!

Thursday 16th December – Class Christmas Parties and Father Christmas


Children will celebrate in class this year and, if they've been good, there may be a special visitor!

Bodsham Sparkles for Children in Need


