Coming to School is the First Priority

As we edge ever closer to Christmas I'm sure we're all keeping a close eye on Covid numbers in the area. I hear that a local school has been forced to close temporarily due to the number of cases there. We remain lucky at Bodsham in that our case numbers are relatively low. As I write there are no children with Covid, but there are some families that are affected.

In a letter to schools this week, the Secretary of State for Education instructed head teachers to make school attendance a priority. He reminded us that the harm caused by disrupted education outweighs the risk of serious illness due to Covid for almost all young children.

Clearly there is a need for balance. At Bodsham we have seen parents choosing to keep their children away from school as a precaution. The Secretary of State would argue that, unless they are ill, they should come to school. I can see both sides!

Next week some families may receive a letter informing them that their child's attendance so far this year is well below the average. I'm sending these letters for information only at this stage, so you as parents can make your decisions about sending children to school with that knowledge.

An Important Message about Medicines

At Bodsham our aim is to help ensure we meet the health needs of our children by agreeing to administer medication (prescription and non-prescription).

Our policy requires parents to deliver all medicines to the school office, where they will be kept securely. Children must not be sent to school with medicines in their bags. Parents must sign a consent form each time medicine is left at school. This will allow us to carefully monitor dosage and timings, to ensure children are kept safe. Children with asthma inhalers kept in school must also be in possession of an Asthma Plan which is drawn up by the child's GP. Again, parental permission is needed for our staff to administer such medicines according to the needs of your child. We will keep careful records of dosage because if the child needs an increasing amount of medication to feel well, paramedics may be needed.



The True Meaning of Christmas

Mrs Gilling has asked us to highlight the work of a local charity that will be helping to make a real difference to the lives of others this Christmas.

Unleashing Lives is a charity working to support homeless people in the Ashford area. Their latest appeal is for items packed into a shoebox that they will wrap and distribute to the homeless at Christmas. The following items which would be ideal to fill your Christmas shoe boxes with are: Deodorants, shampoo, socks, hats/caps, flannels, tooth brushes, tooth paste, chocolate bars/sweets, disposable razors, shaving foam, women's sanitary products, pyjamas, hair accessories, wind up torches, books/crosswords.



You might like to create a Christmas Shoebox at home with your child – to help them to see how they can make a difference to those less fortunate than themselves. Perhaps they'd like to include a Christmas Card in the box with a happy message. There are several drop off points for the boxes around Ashford, but if you can't reach one of them feel free to drop your box at school and we'll pass it on.
